This interactive map highlights our community-engaged research, teaching, outreach, and partnerships. Each point represents a collaboration demonstrating our shared commitment to public impact. This is the interactive map, which is searchable and sortable. You can also find additional information on what the map shows, how to use it, and how to submit your own work. The map shows community-based research, service learning courses, public programs, technical assistance, and partnerships with schools, nonprofits, municipalities, and industry. If you are engaged in community-based work, submit your activity to ensure our full engagement footprint is represented. Let's explore some of the functionalities. At the top of the map, you can see the total number of engagement activities and locations. The total number of engagement activities is displayed on the left. The total number of locations is displayed next to it, along with a dropdown menu to filter by location. When you click on the All dropdown under Locations, a list of all locations appears. You can select specific locations to filter the data. You can also sort by the type of engagement activity using the adjacent dropdown menu. Selecting this dropdown reveals a list of engagement activity types, allowing for further filtering. For example, selecting Research/Creative Activity from the Sort Type of Engagement Activity filter updates the map to show only thirty-six engagement activities. To reset all filters and return to the original view, click on the Reset icon on the top right. Alternatively, you can use the search bar on the right to search for specific engagement activities. The map displays the locations of all engagement activities. At the bottom, a legend explains the colors and symbols used to represent the different types of engagement activities on the map. This shows the icons for sharing the map, viewing in full screen, and other options. The interactive map visualizes the engagement activities. By clicking on a pin, a pop-up window appears with details about the engagement activity at that location. Data reflect activities voluntarily reported by UConn faculty, staff, and units. Information is drawn from the Programs and Scholars database, university travel reports, community engaged scholarship reported through Interfolio, and individual submissions. We welcome additional submissions to ensure the map represents the full scope of UConn's community engagement efforts. This living map reflects how UConn's land-grant mission comes to life through partnership, shared knowledge, and applied scholarship. Our engagement efforts strengthen Connecticut's communities and economy, expand access to opportunity, address real-world challenges, and prepare students for engaged citizenship and leadership. Through sustained collaboration, UConn continues to deepen its impact locally and globally.
